

Cobblestone Recycling Guidelines

These can go in the recycle kart out front:

- ❑ Aluminum and Steel: Aluminum and steel (tin-coated) food and beverage cans and empty aerosol cans. Metal jar lids and metal bottle caps. Please rinse all items.
- ❑ Plastic Containers: Lids OK if tightly screwed on, otherwise not.
- ❑ Newspaper (Including all inserts), Magazines, Catalogs, Office paper, Phone books and Junk mail.
- ❑ Corrugated Cardboard, Paperboard (aka Chipboard) and brown Paper Bags. **Flatten all pieces and cut-up as necessary to save space for others in the kart.**
- ❑ **NO glass (of any kind), plastic bags, ceramic dishes, cups and glassware, Juice boxes/juice pouches, foam cups or packing materials, toys, hazardous waste, garbage.**
- ❑ **Never leave anything beside or in front of the dumpster.**

These go to the Recycling Center:

Glass, batteries, plastic bags, cell phones, ink jet & toner cartridges, used motor oil, oil filters, antifreeze, scrap metal.

The Recycling Center is located a short distance down the highway to Breckenridge in the county commons near the Senior and Community Center and the library. Useful links:

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)

The following items are HHW and must not be put either in the trash or the recycling. They are accepted at the Summit County Waste Facility <https://www.summitcountycogov/103/Landfill-Recycling> (SCWF, 0639 Landfill Road, Dillon, 970.468.9263) during the months of May through November: aerosol cans, antifreeze, chemicals, cleaners, dioxins, fertilizers, **fluorescent bulbs**, gasoline, glue & adhesives, kerosene, mercury thermometers and switches, paints and thinners, pesticides, poisons, prescription drugs. **Tires** are also accepted at SCWF for a \$3-\$5 fee and also at Big-O or Meadow Creek in Frisco. Fees may apply to other items dropped off at SCWF (call first).

These can go to Boulder Eco-Cycle and CHaRM if you get up that way

Plasticized or wax coated cardboard milk and orange juice containers, #6 non-food Styrofoam packing material, used cooking oil (will be processed into biodiesel). Their guidelines are at <http://www.ecocycle.org/athome/>

These are not recyclable as far as we know:

Plastic bottle caps, Styrofoam food containers, motor oil containers, neon colored paper, tissues, napkins, paper towels, paper plates or cups (some can be composted).
