

# Cobblestone Recycling Guidelines

## ***These can go in the recycle kart out front:***

- ❑ Aluminum and Steel: Aluminum and steel (tin-coated) food and beverage cans and empty aerosol cans. Metal jar lids and metal bottle caps. Please rinse all items.
- ❑ Glass Bottles and Jars of any color. Rinse and remove all caps. Please avoid breaking glass. **No window glass, mirrors, light bulbs or dishware.**
- ❑ Plastic Containers: All plastic bottles and jars with a smaller opening than the widest part of the base. Rinse, remove caps and flatten. **No plastic bags, toys, hazardous waste, yogurt or margarine tubs.**
- ❑ Newspaper (Including all inserts), Magazines, Catalogs, Office paper, Phone books and Junk mail.
- ❑ Corrugated Cardboard, Paperboard (aka Chipboard) and brown Paper Bags. **Flatten all pieces** and place inside paper bag or cardboard box equivalent to size of 18-gallon bin.
- ❑ **NO plastic bags, yogurt tubs, margarine tubs, window glass, mirrors, light bulbs, dishware, toys, hazardous waste, garbage.**

## ***These go to the High Country Conservation Center:***

Plastic butter and cottage cheese tubs, batteries, plastic bags, cell phones, ink jet & toner cartridges, used motor oil, oil filters, antifreeze, scrap metal.

The High Country Conservation Center (formerly the Summit Recycling Project) is located a short distance down the highway to Breckenridge in the county commons near the Senior and Community Center (turn right at the light where Peak 1 Blvd intersects Highway 9). Their sorting guidelines are at

## ***Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)***

The following items are HHW and must not be put either in the trash or the recycling. They are accepted at the [Summit County Waste Facility](#) (SCWF, 0639 Landfill Road, Dillon, 970.468.9263) during the months of May through November: aerosol cans, antifreeze, chemicals, cleaners, dioxins, fertilizers, **fluorescent bulbs**, gasoline, glue & adhesives, kerosene, mercury thermometers and switches, paints and thinners, pesticides, poisons, prescription drugs. **Tires** are also accepted at SCWF for a \$3-\$5 fee and also at Big-O or Meadow Creek in Frisco. Fees may apply to other items dropped off at SCWF (call first).

## ***These go to Boulder Eco-Cycle and CHaRM***

Plasticized or wax coated cardboard milk and orange juice containers, #6 non-food Styrofoam packing material, used cooking oil (will be processed into biodiesel). Their guidelines are at <http://www.ecocycle.org/athome/>

## ***These are not recyclable as far as we know:***

Plastic bottle caps, Styrofoam food containers, motor oil containers, neon colored paper, tissues, napkins, paper towels, paper plates or cups.
